Awards have been organized into four sections:

## WESTMOUNT SCHOOL COMPLEX AWARDS

### **DAN CONRAD MEMORIAL CITIZENSHIP BURSARY AWARD**

\$200

Students must have a good academic record and have demonstrated strong involvement and leadership in community & school activities. The successful student will receive the cash bursary only if he/she is continuing a post-secondary education within two years. However, a plaque will be awarded to the successful candidate and a permanent award, properly inscribed, will remain on display in the school.

Application forms are available at the office.

Deadline - May 1

### **DEVOS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP**

(also supported by The Great-West Life Assurance Company)

\$1,500

This scholarship is available to students who live near Bruxelles and attend high school at Westmount School Complex or at Glenboro School. Applicants need to have a high academic standing (B+ or better) and need to be involved in sports and community volunteerism. Recipient must be accepted at a Manitoba university.

### **GUS BALTESSEN AND EVELYN (SIMOENS) BALTESSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

\$600 renewable for four years

This award is for graduating students who came from Ste. Marie School and who are continuing to post-secondary education in Manitoba. Criteria: financial need, marks, and extra-curricular activities. Students cannot receive any other bursary upon graduation. Letter of application to be submitted to Ms. Rohleder.

### **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS CAMPEAU COUNCIL 4447 SCHOLARSHIP**

\$300

Students must be taking at least a 75% course load at Westmount School Complex or Pilot Mound Collegiate and be continuing on to post-secondary education. Criteria include satisfactory academic standing, active involvement or leadership in school activities, and demonstrated citizenship in community affairs. Preference will be given to candidates whose father or grandfather is a brother Knight.

### **MARIAPOLIS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

Applicant must have satisfactory academic standing in at least 75% of a full academic program of studies at the Senior 4 level, be involved in school activities, demonstrate school and community leadership and citizenship, and be pursuing post-secondary education.

\$250

This bursary has traditionally been awarded to students who took the courses offered in French at Somerset School and who elected to take further studies at St. Boniface College. \$300

In true memory of her spirit, the recipient of this award will be hard-working, selfless, a good citizen, humble, and have a positive attitude. Submit a Grad Awards Application.

**MRS. BRENDA THOMSON OUTSTANDING LANGUAGE ARTS AWARD**

\$100, plus keeper trophy and name engraved on school plaque

This award will be given to a student who has maintained a mark above 80% in Grade 9 to 12 English Language Arts and has participated in other activities which pertain to Language Arts. Examples of other activities: school concerts, Christmas concerts, Mountain Poetry & Drama Festival, Mountain Music Festival, 4-H Communications, school yearbook, student council, student voice, or having editorials, poetry, and short stories published. Submit a letter of application.

**PRIX DE FRANÇAIS DU COMITÉ CULTUREL**

A gift from the cultural committee

This award is offered to a student who has completed the Français 40S or 40G course, who has opted for the Social Studies courses which are offered in the French language, and who has made an effort to express pride in the French culture. Submit a Grad Awards Application.

**RBC ROYAL BANK SOMERSET SCHOLARSHIP**

\$200

This annual award is given to the graduating student with the highest overall academic standing.

No application necessary – selected by the school

**SOMERSET ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR SCHOOL LEADERSHIP VOLUNTEERISM AWARD**

\$100

This award will be given to a student who has helped their community through volunteering. Submit a Grad Awards Application.

Deadline – May 1

**SOMERSET SCHOOL CITIZENSHIP AWARD**

Trophy, not always available

Student must have taken five Senior 4 courses and must have demonstrated: courtesy, thoughtfulness, respect of property and others, and participated in various school activities. Submit a Grad Awards Application.

**CAISSE PEMBINA BURSARY**

\$500 awarded between École Somerset School and Westmount School

Graduates must be continuing on to post-secondary studies. Applicants must have shown good school spirit, good citizenship, and respect for the other pupils and teaching staff. Preference will be given to students who receive the minimum number of bursaries.

Deadline – May 1

**CARRIE ANN VAN DAMME MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

\$500

Any resident of the R. M. of Argyle who is in first year university and who is majoring in a business-related program. Criteria are marks, extra curricular activities and community involvement.

Deadline - January 13 (of 1st year university)

**COMMUNITY FUTURES HEATLAND INC. – BUSINESS SCHOLARSHIP**

\$1,000 – 3 scholarships

Available to students from the Heartland region who are pursuing a post-secondary diploma program in the next academic year and ultimately a career in business. Students must be entering the two year Business Administration program at either Red River College, Assiniboine Community College, or College universitaire de Saint-Boniface.

This is a renewable award for up to four years. Applicant must live in the R.M. of Lorne and be pursuing post-secondary education. Written applications to include your involvement in school and or community affairs, statement of marks, field of studies planned and duration, and any other pertinent information.

**FOUNDATION SANTE NOTRE DAME HEALTH FOUNDATION BURSARY**

\$1,000

The recipient must reside within the Notre Dame Health Foundation District and must be pursuing post-secondary education in the health care field. The student must be bilingual and demonstrate acceptable scholastic aptitudes and must evoke a good sense of moral and civic responsibility, and be polite, respectful of property, professors and other students. An application form showing participation in extra-curricular school and community activities as well as two letters of reference and a transcript of marks must be submitted.

Deadline - May 15

**LORNE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUXILIARY AWARD**

\$500 - lottery system, preference given to longest period of training

This award is available to students who are registered for their final year of a health related program. (Examples: doctor, dietitian, psychiatric nurse, health care aide, x-ray technician) Also, the applicant must have graduated from Westmount School Complex or Ecole Somerset School.

Deadline - September 30 (after graduation)

**MOUNTAIN FOUNDATION BURSARY**

\$400

This is awarded to the student who best achieves the following criteria: has demonstrated good citizenship, works to full potential, has maintained healthy academic standards, shall continue on to post-secondary education or apprenticeship training in the following year, and is involved in extra-curricular activities. A student is not eligible for this bursary, if already a recipient of a bursary of higher value. The recipient must have been enrolled in one of our schools for his/her Grade 11 and 12 years. Foreign students are not eligible.

Letter of application to be submitted to your principal and one nominee will be forwarded to Division Office for consideration.

**PEMBINA CONSUMERS COOPERATIVE BURSARY**

\$300

Awarded to any École Somerset or Westmount student choosing to continue his/her education in a journeyman program for carpentry, plumbing, or electrical trades. Criteria includes: a high academic standing, involvement in school and community activities, and good leadership qualities. The bursary will be awarded to the successful candidate in the second semester.

Deadline - May 1

**PEMBINA VALLEY MINOR HOCKEY REGION SCHOLARSHIP**

\$500 (three awards)

The recipients of these scholarship awards must have participated in the sport of hockey (player, official, coach) and will be continuing with post-secondary studies. Criteria include academic standing, leadership and sportsmanship qualities. An essay is required.

Deadline - April 7

**PRAIRIE SPIRIT GRADUATE MERIT AWARD**

\$300 (1 award if 15 or fewer graduates, 2 awards if over 15 graduates)

The recipient will be selected using the following criteria: completion of course requirements for graduation; demonstration of consistent effort in scholastic achievement throughout his/her high school years; participation in extra-curricular activities such as sports, drama, school newspaper; demonstration of qualities of leadership and service to others through participation in activities such as student council, yearbook, canteen, etc.; and demonstration of good citizenship qualities such as courtesy, respect, and consideration for others.

**PRAIRIE SPIRIT TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP**

\$150

Students must enter an education program or University 1 of a Canadian university directly out of a PSSD high school with the intent of pursuing university education towards their Bachelor of Education. The guidance counselor or awards committee will select the recipient.

**REGIONAL HEALTH AUTHORITY- CENTRAL MANITOBA EDUCATION BURSARIES**

up to \$4,000

Students must be in their second last or last year of post-secondary training in a high demand profession in the medical field (nursing, lab/x-ray, rehab, pharmacy, etc). This is a return of service agreement whereas you agree to work for the RHA for one year if you receive the \$2,000 scholarship (you can receive two years of scholarship). **ROCK LAKE HEALTH DISTRICT AND PRAIRIE VIEW LODGE FOUNDATIONS BURSARY PROGRAM**

Up to \$5,000 (recipient will sign a return of service commitment to Rock lake Health District)

Students must already be in their post-secondary program. The bursary is available to students in high demand professions such as nursing, diagnostics, medicine and pharmacy.

**STEVENSON'S PHARMACY SCIENCE AWARD**

\$500

The recipient must have outstanding performance in Pre-Calculus Math 40S and a minimum of two Grade 12 science courses. Applicants must be registered for post-secondary study. This scholarship may be extended for a further four years at \$1,000 per year for recipients who are accepted into the Faculty of Pharmacy at the University of Manitoba. Applicants are to submit their transcript as well as a one page letter expressing their future educational and career plans.

**AGRICULTURE AND FOOD SCIENCES CENTENNIAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP**

\$2,000 (four awards)

This scholarship will be awarded to Manitoba high school students who plan to enter the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences at The University of Manitoba. Eligible students may enter either the two-year Diploma in Agriculture program or the four-year Bachelor of Science degree program. Students entering the degree program must register for a specific set of courses in University 1 as determined by the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences and as outlined in the university STARTbook. Applicant must have a minimum average of 75%, provide a résumé, and briefly outline their vision for rural Manitoba and their career goals.
